

Joe Edelman: Images Re-Imagined

Thursday, April 11, 7pm

When someone views your photos, they will NEVER have the same experience that you did when you created it. For a photographer who is learning and improving his/her craft, seeing your images re-processed, cropped, and finished by another photographer can give you excellent insight into how others perceive your work, and give you a better understanding of your strengths and weaknesses as well as what techniques and aspects of your photography that you should be paying more attention to.

Working in Lightroom and Photoshop, and using images volunteered by club members, Joe will review the images, demonstrate how he would post process them and crop them all while explaining WHY.

This is where you come in. Joe is planning on working on 5-10 diverse member photos (time permitting) and needs them sent to him in advance. If you'd like to submit one of your photographs for consideration for inclusion in the set please send them as directed below no later than Friday, April 5. The goal is to provide him with a range of subjects and styles. Photos should be good to start with. He will not be editing to fix major flaws, but rather to enhance what is there to make a good photo great.

Provide a full size jpg that you have already processed (demonstrating your vision) along with the completely unedited RAW file. Please name the two files exactly the same (make sure not to change the file extension) and include your name in there. **Jpgs without the accompanying RAW file cannot be accepted. Upload both files here**. No login is necessary.
