

Monthly Presentation: Thursday, April 8 at 7pm

Robert Zurfluh – Landscape Photography 101: Getting started with Landscapes. Equipment, Techniques, Composition, Post-processing, Scouting

Robert's talk is targeted at beginner and intermediate photographers who would like to learn more about landscape photography. His presentation will cover essential equipment, including camera, lenses, filters, as well as how to select a tripod and a backpack for travel, and what accessories to bring along. Camera settings for landscape photography including but not limited to using HDR (high dynamic range), long exposure, and ETTR (exposing to the right) will be covered along with the importance of light, scouting locations, composition, and basic post-processing.

Robert grew up in the 1970's in a small Bavarian town and was always fascinated by the American landscape I saw in books, movies, and on American TV shows. He bought his first camera, an Agfa Pocket camera, after saving up money he made delivering the Sunday newspaper in the early 80's. He bought his first SLR camera after arriving in the US in 1990 and made the jump to digital photography in 2009 after attending a free Canon workshop in Acadia National Park, and realizing that digital camera technology had in many ways surpassed traditional film. Since then, he has been photographing mostly landscapes and wildlife subjects.

Robert's day job as a Registered Dietitian for a large company allows him to travel to various parts of the United States, and if he wants to explore, he brings his gear along and spends an additional vacation day or two in an area.

Over the past few years, he has judged several camera club competitions in New Jersey and given an occasional talk on trip planning, from scouting locations, to executing the photograph and post-processing images in Lightroom. Some of his images have been featured in journals, calendars, and on corporate and non-profit websites.

Robert says, "To me, photography as a lifelong journey in which there is always room to discover something new and to grow. Most importantly, however,

photography is something that should always be enjoyable."

- 2. Each meeting will be limited to 12 photographers for critiquing selected on a first come first serve basis. The meeting is open to all members, so, even if your work isn't being critiqued, you are welcome to come and watch and learn. If we have a large response, we will try to schedule additional sessions.
- 3. Since we may not be able to get to all of your images, please specify the order you'd like them reviewed so that we can prioritize the requests.
