This is a weekday event. Im looking forward to spring and our field trip to Bombay hook, one of my favorite places to visit. I'd like to meet at the visitor center parking lot between 8:15 and 8:30am on Monday, April 22. There is a small fee to enter to refuge, I believe it is \$4 per car, for the day, or just \$12 for the entire year. There are bathrooms at the visitor center for anyone who needs them, and I believe two spots along the route. This is a drivable loop that also has trails you can park and walk

down if you choose. Travel slowly, take your time, and you are almost guaranteed to see something! If you have binoculars, it would be good to bring them along. In April, eaglets are hatching and parents might be busy fishing and flying around looking for food. I have seen egrets, herons, kingfisher, screech owl, short-eared owl, great horned owl, barred owl, fox, ducks, cedar waxwings, bluebirds, otter, snow geese, snakes, the list goes on and on. You never know what you might see! There really isn't much in the immediate area for lunch, so I would recommend packing a cooler. Hopefully the weather cooperates, and we have a great day!
