# Photoshop Layers and Masking, Saturday, February 18, 10 am, in person and via Zoom\*

### **Presented by Rich Lewis**

To edit a photograph in Adobe Photoshop, layers are used to make global adjustments, and masks within a layer give you the ability to apply adjustments to a specific area of a photograph. This workshop will introduce you to these features of layers and masks:

- An introduction to the concept of layering your image adjustments.
- What is the purpose of the specific adjustment layers?
- How to apply masks to a layer to reveal and hide the effects of an adjustment layer.
- An introduction to layer blending modes to tailor how an adjustment is applied to a photograph.

Don't worry if some of these terms are new to you. They will be explained with the goal of introducing the amazing power of Photoshop to your photography. This workshop is geared for SJCC members who are relatively new to Photoshop.

\*Please note: even though we will be streaming the workshop live on Zoom, due to a degree of interactivity and limitations of the Zoom platform, the program will be best experienced in person.
