## Are you ready? YOU CAN DO IT!

The SJCC board has been at work all summer to get ready for this season's

launch next month. Here's a brief rundown of what we've been up to:

- The competition schedule has been finalized and can be found here on our website. In an effort to properly communicate our expectations and achieve more consistent scoring between judges, we have revamped our scoring definitions to more clearly differentiate between each score in our gamut of 4-9. Our judges will all receive this information prior to the competition. You can view these definitions here in the Competition Awards section of the Rules page on our site.
- We are wrapping up our presentation programs and will publish those soon.
- A mentoring program for Beginners is in development, with a tentative launch in October. Stay tuned.
- Returning for this season are:
  - The Project Project, every other month beginning in October
  - Mobile Photography Users Group (MPUG), now on the second Tuesday of each month.
  - Critique Sessions, as demand warrants, first one in November
- New this year: The SJCC Drone Flyers take off with a pilot meeting on August 26.

They are an excellent opportunity for shooting, learning, and socializing, and we'd love to bring them back without putting any of our members at risk. # **Monthly Presentation:** Thursday, September 9 at 7pm Wabi-Sabi by Lisa Cuchara

This program will explore the beauty of imperfect and/or unconventional subjects. As nature photographers we often seek out the flowers, leaves and such that are perfect, with no blemishes or defects. This program highlights subjects that are not perfect, such as flowers that have character, double headed flowers, decaying fall leaves, the deformed coneflower that stands out as flawed and hence different and beautiful, rust as it creates abstract patterns amidst the decay, etc.

We will also explore the concept of slowing down and appreciating the beauty of everyday life, things that might be overlooked. As purveyors of rust and decay we appreciate the perseverance and beauty of "life after humans" as cars and equipment falls apart and succumbs to oxidation and decay.

Wabi-Sabi teaches us to find beauty in everyday life. It is a kind of antiaesthetic, an alternative to the dominating discriminatory ideas we hold about beauty

Lisa Cuchara, PhD, Master Craftsman (PPA), Master of Photography (M. Photog.) HonNEC, is very passionate about photography and she enjoys both being behind the lens and in the digital darkroom. She loves to photograph nature but finds many subjects equally intriguing.
