# Monthly Presentation: Thursday, January 12 at 7pm via Zoom Creativity with Textures and Composites by Hazel Meredith

See how you can take a "ho hum" image and make it into your own "work of art". Learn how to work with textures and compositing several images to create your own artistic vision.

Hazel will show you how to create your own textures – both from photos and with brushes in Photoshop (or Elements) – then combine them with photos to create looks from subtle to dramatic. You will learn how to do simple composites like changing a sky, as well as more complex creations with several images.

Hazel Meredith is an award-winning photographer and a sought-after teacher, speaker, and competition judge. She began teaching in 2007, and now does seminars at camera clubs and conferences across the U.S. – both in-person and virtual.
