We've done an analysis of when members are submitting their competition entries. Interestingly, roughly 40% of the files are uploaded during the last day of the entry



A number of people have inquired about the way the competition records are sorted on our website. By default, they appear alphabetically by first name but, what may not be obvious, feature the ability to fine tune data sort to fit the way you like to view it. Clicking on the arrows will toggle through different sorting options. For example, one

click on the total score arrow will display standings by points in ascending order. Another click will reverse that order. Names can be re-sorted in reverse alpha order. Focusing on the Details: Create Fine Art Photographs from Urban Exploration Lisa and Tom Cuchara

Lisa and Tom will discuss love for RUST and their approach to and experience with photographing historic and abandoned buildings, urban decay, etc. They will show techniques for wide angle and close-up photography including the use of HDR (high dynamic range), EDR (extended dynamic range), HDR-panoramas, and light

painting in this program. Equipment and techniques used to bring out the beauty and drama of these subjects will also be discussed as we show our fascination with RUST. They aim to inspire you: inspire you to visit new "old" places and to get to know them well enough to tell their story, inspire you to capture high dynamic range images and to light paint, and inspire you to create art from decay.

Lisa Cuchara, PhD, Cr. Photog., HonNEC, is very passionate about photography and enjoys both being behind the lens and in the digital darkroom. From birds and flowers to babies and UrBex/HDR, she appreciates the world around her and embraces the challenge of interpreting what her eyes see and her heart feels via her photographs. Lisa says that photography allows her to pay attention to the details, to be mindful, to slow down and appreciate all of the beauty, details and nuances of everyday life. Lisa met her husband Tom through photography and they are both very active in many local, national, and international photography organizations. Lisa and Tom have been photographing people professionally for more than 15 years and have their own photography study in Hamden, CT. They have had many successful gallery exhibitions, their work has been accepted into many juried exhibitions and their images have won awards at the local, state, national, and international levels and have been widely published in various media. They present a wide variety of motivational and instructional programs and workshops at many photography groups and organizations. Layers and masks are the heart and soul of Photoshop, but blending modes are the spice to allow you to blend layers together to create effects. Have some fun with your photographs and come join Lisa as she wills show you how Blend modes will enhance your creativity. Changing the blending modes alters the way that particular photograph or layer or texture interacts with the photograph underneath. Be creative and experiment -- try different modes and use a specific opacity to get the creative result that you are looking for. Lisa will show you how to use the multiply and screen blend modes for night photography, the multiply and screen blend modes for exposure alterations, and for more effective, non-destructive dodging and burning.

This is a hands-on workshop, bring your computer with Adobe Photoshop CC installed (Photoshop CS6 OK). You can share a computer with a friend. You can come without a computer and just watch (some people learn better hands-on, some people learn better watching). Any skill level welcome but please note that this is *not* a computer class, so basic computer skills are assumed (you should be able to open files and navigate to and open files that will be provided to you at the start of the class, those skills are not unique to image editing and would apply to MS Word, Excel, etc.).
