Monthly Presentation: Thursday, October 12, at 7pm via Zoom How AI is Changing Photography - Bert Sirkin

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is RAPIDLY changing the photography world. In less than a year, AI has changed how we think of "photography". Over the several years, the word "AI" has crept into just about every aspect of photography. Our cameras have AI features built into them; the tools we use to edit our images have AI built into them; we can now create "photographs" from mere text. These past 2 years were just the tip of the AI iceberg, as AI is continuing to evolve and will have more and more impact on our future lives.

This presentation is about 2 hours in length. In this presentation Bert will briefly review the history of AI, how AI affects our daily lives, what AI tools are available for photography and how photographers can best make use of these new tools. He will demonstrate various AI options available to photographers today showing the different ways you can use the AI features in Photoshop along with several other AI tools.
