WORKSHOP - Backup at Home & On The Road Saturday, December 2, at 10AM

Backing up important files on your computer or phone is one of those things that most people have good intentions of taking care of, but often they don't take care of as much as they would like. For many of us, there is almost nothing more important than preserving our photos, many of which are pictures of loved family members. For others, their photos represent many hours of travel and hard work in order to create them. In this in-depth workshop, Mike Fox and Dwayne Botnick will go over various options and approaches in developing a regular habit of backing up our photos (and other files) so that they are safe from the ills that can impact our modern computing devices.

You will learn about the various backup methods that exist, when to use each of them, as well as the different options for storing your backups offsite so that if something happens to your home, your images will be protected. We will also go over some approaches to backing up images when away from home, such as when you are on an extended trip

Monthly Presentation: Thursday, December 14, at 7pm via Zoom Milky Way Photography for Beginners - Julia Vaughan

In this comprehensive session geared toward beginning and intermediate night sky photographers, you will learn the basics of Milky Way photography, from planning to capturing to post-processing your images. In Planning, Julia will cover where and

when to find the Milky Way core, mobile apps and other resources to help you plan, and what to bring. In Capturing, she will review camera settings, focusing techniques, single shots, foreground illumination, and provide introductions to image stacking and blends. The session will wrap up with Post-Processing, which will cover basic editing in Adobe Lightroom and Photoshop, including color, contrast, noise reduction and sharpening.

Julia Vaughan is a landscape and nature photographer based in Portland, Oregon. Her childhood in the green hills of Vermont gave her an appreciation of nature at an early age. Since her first camera in high school, she has loved capturing, revisiting and sharing special moments.
