# Floral Photography with Passion Thursday, January 11 at 7PM

Presented by: Padma Inguva

Padma will share information about some of her techniques in creating stunning flower portraits.

These techniques include photographing flowers on Lightbox, multiple exposures both in Camera and via Photoshop, applying textures to floral images, selective focus, blurred backgrounds, compositional elements, backlighting, and bokeh! This program also includes tips on processing colors which are considered difficult to photograph, like red and purple.

In her own words "My goal as a photographer is to get people to slow down, unite with the natural world and absorb the beauty of flowers, create an oasis in this rapid, constantly demanding stressful daily life. An object in motion stays in motion – until you point your camera at it. Freeze the action or accentuate it and capture the moment.

## **Prints: Open**

Both digital entries and print entries must be uploaded to PhotoContest Pro If you are unsure of how to upload your challenge entries, now is a good time to acquaint yourself with the process. There are useful videos & instructions here. Even if you are comfortable with it, it wouldn't hurt to check to see if your password is working. Doing this before the deadline crunch will assure that we can help you sort out any problems. To avoid disqualification and disappointment, you should review the Challenge Guidelines as they have been updated. The guidelines also contain all of the detail for your prints.

<u>Tuesday, February 20:</u> Digital: Weather [Neither rain, nor snow, nor sleet, nor hail shall keep the photographer from creating an engaging image of atmospheric conditions]. <u>Tuesday, March 19:</u> Digital: Machines [Apparatus using or applying mechanical power. Use your skills to turn work machines into works of art].

<u>Tuesday, April 16:</u> Digital: Translucent [Capture light shining through an object without seeing through it].

<u>Tuesday, May 21:</u> Digital: Abundance [There's a whole lot of opportunity to capture a whole lot of something. Your interpretation can be literal or figurative.].

<u>Tuesday, June 18:</u> Digital: Street Photography [Capture a candid moment of humanity in a public setting].

Prints are always "Open" unless stated otherwise.

## Saturday, January 13: Lightroom - Part 1

10AM - Noon at Medford United Methodist Church

Presented by: Chuck Kuski

Lightroom is a powerful image editing and organization program. In this workshop, Chuck Kuski, a longtime Lightroom user, will give a general overview for those who are new to Lightroom or just having problems getting started. What is Lightroom? What does it do? How do I install it? How do I get my images into it? Where are the pictures? What should I do next? It is intended to help the photographer get ready for more intermediate and advanced workshops. Chuck will also cover some of the "best practices" when editing your photos in Lightroom. It is expected that 1/3 of the workshop will be devoted to Q &

A. If you're expecting to learn details about the seven different modules in LR, this is not the workshop for you. If you do not know what modules are, or have basic knowledge of them, then this may be the workshop for you.

## Saturday, February 17: Lightroom - Part 2

Many of us have thousands, if not tens of thousands, of photos on our computers which we have taken over the years. Adobe's Lightroom program has been a favorite tool for photographers to edit and to hone their images since it was released in early 2007. In addition to its editing prowess, Lightroom also has some very powerful features which can help us to organize and cull our collection and which makes it much easier to find photos that we are looking for in our photographic haystack, or to collect images into a group for a specific project.

One of Lightroom's standout attributes is its exceptional search functionality. With remarkable precision, these tools allow us to pinpoint images based on the lens used, shutter speed settings, specific dates, or any combination thereof. And once we get into the habit of using keywords, they can be a huge help in finding the photos we are looking for. In this workshop, Mike Fox and Dwayne Botnick will introduce and demonstrate the power of many of the tools mentioned above.
